- **CPT Math Placement**

- **Math 950 & Below:**
  - Student will remediate in “Math Lab” at the appropriate level and eventually will be placed in Intermediate Algebra.
- **Math 990**
  - Student will be placed in Intermediate Algebra.
- **Math 1010**
  - Student will be placed in Math 1010 unless they have not taken Intermediate Algebra as this must precede Math 1010. Accuplacer Reading 58 is also required.
- **Math 1050**
  - Only students who are currently in Precalculus will be placed in Math 1050. Accuplacer English 1010 placement is also required.
- Students may re-take the CPT math test twice per semester (\$15).

- **CPT English Placement**

- All students are placed in Language Arts 11 regardless of their English CPT score.
- BIOL 1010, BIOL 1610, CHEM 1210, COMM 1010, HUMA 1100, PSY 1010 and most On-Campus classes require an Accuplacer placement score.
- English 1010 is not an option for any student until the summer semester after their junior year.
- Students may re-take the CPT English test once per semester (\$15).
- All students will be required to register and take the ACT in October.



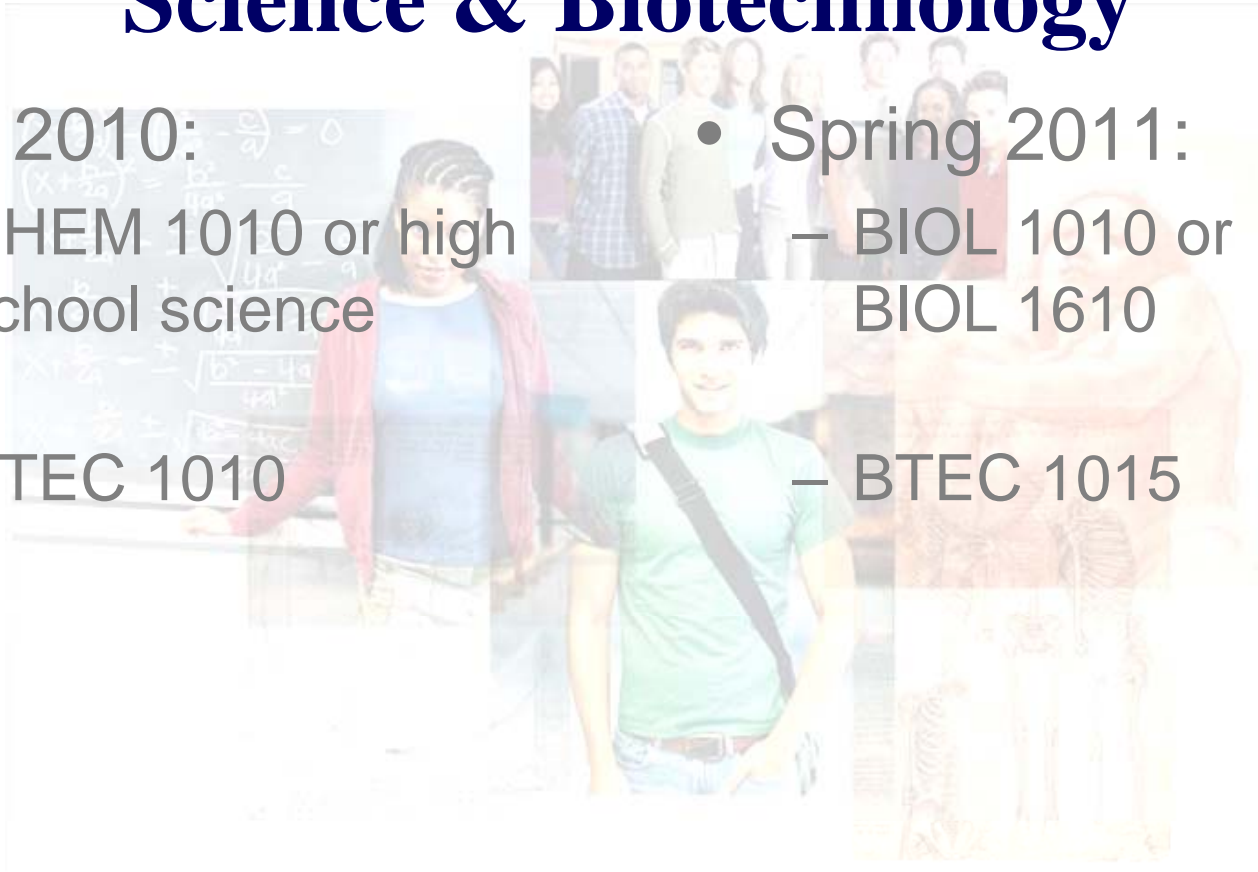
## Getting a “Jump Start” on College

- **SLCC On-Campus Concurrent Enrollment**
  - Must register on your SLCC “MyPage” and submit required paperwork
- **SLCC Early Enrollment**
  - Must test at the ENGL 1010 and MATH 1010 level or higher
  - Must turn in application paperwork to SLCC before registration
- **USU / CEU Distance Ed**
  - Must register and attend courses at CHHS
  - Courses taught over the EdNet system
- **Art 1600 (Pottery) through Itineris**
  - Five seats available (e-mail Matt, lottery if necessary)
  - Studio located near Jordan Landing (Mon & Wed 3:30-5:30)

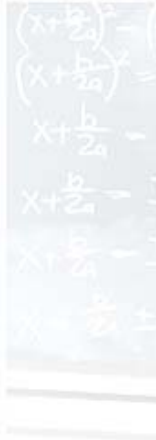



Students **MUST** check with their boundary school prior to registration to determine which classes are needed. Students are encouraged to bring a list of **FAILED** classes to registration. Counselors are not available during Summer School to review transcripts or report cards. **Please only sign up for the classes the student needs – no refunds will be given or changes made for incorrect classes taken.**

#### Registration Fees

- \$45.00 Registration fee plus \$25.00 per class (.25 credit)
- Fees are non-refundable and due in full at the time of registration.
- Pay with cash, check or money order only. Checks payable to Valley High School.
- We cannot accept debit or credit cards.
- If a student pays with a check and it is returned, no credit/grades will be given for the summer school session.
- Fee Waivers are not accepted for make-up classes.

#### Attendance and Credit

- Grades earned in Summer School do not replace the original grade earned by the student.
- Classes offered count only for make-up of "FAILED" classes.
- Classes taken will not count towards early graduation.
- Students will be **FAILED** on the **SECOND** absence.
- Class work must be completed during the summer school session. No NG's or I's will be given.
- Students may sign up for a maximum of 5 regular classes per day. Drop-in Classes: life sports, life fitness, work release careers may be added in addition.
- Report cards will be mailed home approximately **2 weeks after** the session ends.

**Class availability is first come, first served. Come early, as some classes will sell out.**

#### First Session

**Registration:** June 7<sup>th</sup> or 8<sup>th</sup>, 8:00 am – 2:00 pm

**Schedule:** Monday June 14<sup>th</sup> – Thursday July 1<sup>st</sup>  
(No school on Friday July 2<sup>nd</sup>)  
Each class is 1 hour and runs Monday-Friday. School hours are 9:00 am – 2:00 pm daily.

#### Second Session

**Registration:** July 6<sup>th</sup> or 7<sup>th</sup>, 8:00 am – 2:00 pm

**Schedule:** Monday July 12<sup>th</sup> – Friday July 30<sup>th</sup>  
(No school on Friday July 23<sup>rd</sup>)  
Each class is 1 hour and runs Monday-Friday. School hours are 9:00 am – 2:00 pm daily.

## Advanced Placement (AP) U.S. History

### – **Criteria for enrollment:**

- English 1010 Placement (CPT) and...
  - 3.0 GPA in Social Studies Courses and...
  - Willingness to Work Exceptionally Hard
- OR**
- Pass a Social Studies AP Test (3 or higher) and...
  - Willingness to Work Exceptionally Hard
- OR**
- Submit an Appeal if Placement Criteria is Not Met

## **The New Century Scholarship Program**

- Students who complete the Associate Degree requirements by June 1<sup>st</sup> of their high school graduation year are eligible\*
- Students must apply by February 1<sup>st</sup> of the year they graduate from high school\*
- Student must have and maintain a 3.0 on their college transcript
- Students must have and maintain a 3.5 high school gpa\*
- Scholarship award amounts will be determined annually\*

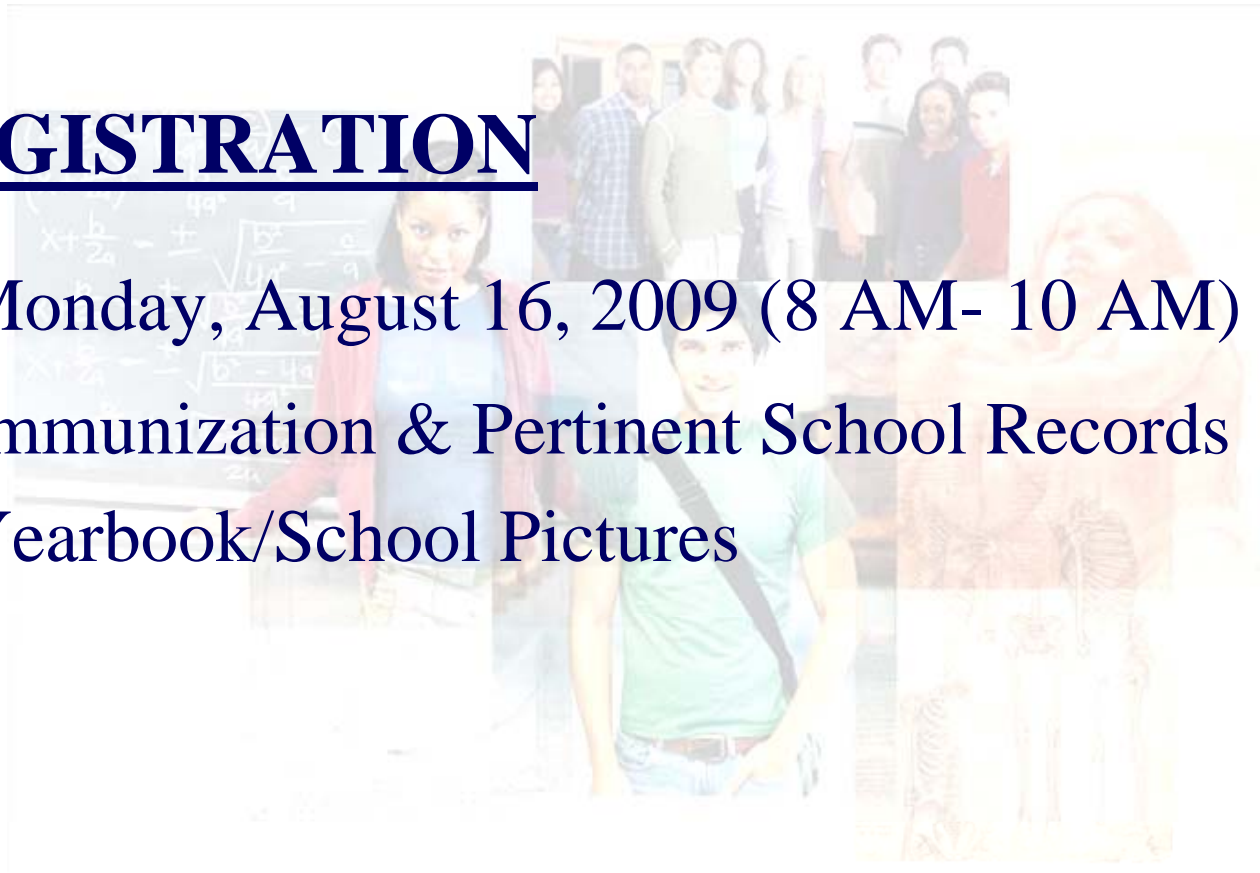
