SLCC Graduation

Students who plan on graduating from SLCC with their Associate Degree this spring must apply for graduation by October 15, 2010. To apply, students must complete the graduation application (available online at: www.slcc.edu/graduation) and submit the application and \$25 fee to the college (complete instructions are described on the application form).

Students who plan on graduating after the summer semester must submit the graduation form and fee by February 15, 2011.

All Associate Degree graduates (spring and summer) are eligible to participate in commencement exercises at SLCC on May 6, 2011.



Scholarship Opportunities

Scholarship application season is now upon us and will continue into the spring. Seniors are receiving guidance during *Connect Time* directing them to the numerous opportunities available to them from institutions of higher education as well as other public and private sources.

In general, there are three resources that students and parents can research as they look for scholarship opportunities: Institutions of higher learning, opportunities from both public and private entities being advertised by Itineris guidance counselors, and search engines.

The best place to begin researching and exploring all three of these avenues is the Guidance section of the Itineris Early College website. Students and parents can begin looking for opportunities by going to: www.iechs.org and navigate to "Guidance" and then "Scholarships."

Opportunities that are advertised by Itineris' guidance counselors are updated weekly (sometimes even daily during the busiest time of the year). Listing are also published by expiration date which should help facilitate organization as students seek out and apply for scholarships. Students should be applying for every opportunity available to them from now through the spring.



Changes to SLCC's On-Campus Concurrent Enrollment

Salt Lake Community College's On-Campus Concurrent Enrollment program is changing beginning with registration for Spring semester 2011. Because of the confusion between registering for Early Enrollment and On-Campus Concurrent Enrollment, no longer will student be able to register online for On-Campus Concurrent Enrollment courses.

Juniors at Itineris generally do not take On-Campus Concurrent Enrollment classes during the school year. Seniors who wish to take On-Campus Concurrent Enrollment classes Spring semester must attend a registration meeting at SLCC in order to acquire the necessary registration paperwork.

All men ages 18-25 living in the United States must register with Selective Service. It's the law. According to law, a man must register with Selective Service within 30 days of his 18th birthday.

In order to be eligible for federal financial aid or a job with the U.S. government, individuals must comply with the Selective Service law.
